Certified Peer Support Specialists...

- Maintain certification through Idaho State approved Training Facility by completing 10 hours of CEU which are approved by the certifying body for Idaho's CPS Services each year.
- Work with adult clients experiencing a behavioral health crisis to provide support and encouragement during client's difficult moments.
- Establish goals with clients, as well as manage crisis in collaboration with a licensed clinician; assist adult clients on achieving their personal recovery goals.
- Provide individualized education and training; foster opportunities for improvement of client's independence and daily functioning; provide hope and encouragement by serving as a role model in recovery; through sharing experience from personal recovery to promote growth and change; offer education and support in working toward physical and mental wellness, including healthy living behaviors.
- Complete all relevant documentation (assessments, treatment plans, quarterly updates, progress notes, and all other significant data) in accordance with Medicaid, Optum, and Pride Mental Health; submit case notes and corresponding time sheets weekly, as well as attend weekly supervision and staff meetings, AND maintain confidentiality of all client documents, files, and communication in written, electronic, and/or verbal form.
- Communicate and collaborate with supervisors, client's counselor(s), TCM, CBRS, and other client support professionals on a consistent basis.
- Participate in any in-service training for Team members.
- Adhere/Comply to all Medicaid, Optum, and Pride Mental Health ethical guidelines, policies, and procedures, as well as the ACA Code of Ethics.
- The CPS worker will be required to complete an adjudication form annually.



Minimum Qualifications:

- Be at least 18 years or older.
- Must have a high school diploma (or equivalent).
- Must be able to pass a criminal background check as required by DHW and Optum.
- Be self-identified as a current or former consumer of mental health services and well-grounded in his/her own recovery.
- Must be certified through State of Idaho approved Training Program/Facility (BPA); must have completed the 5 days, 40-hour training course (which addresses cultural competency) through Idaho State approved Training Program/Facility (BPA).
- Must have a valid driver's license with no more than 2 driving violations within past 3 years (no DUI or reckless driving within 5 years) and reliable transportation.
- Must be able to work with people with disabilities, specifically with a mental health disability.
- Ability to work with diverse cultures and populations who are experiencing a behavioral health crisis.
